Rugby World Cup sees the launch of an ethical bystander initiative. Sex attacks are expected to increase during the Rugby World Cup - and bystanders are being urged to intervene to stop them. Agencies including police, the Wellington Sexual Abuse Network and Regional Public Health have banded together for the **Who are You?** initiative, which aims to raise public awareness of how sexual assaults can be prevented.

An educational video has been produced for use in schools and hospitality training institutes, with talks planned at schools to encourage young women to appoint a "guardian angel", like a designated driver, to stay sober and look out for the group's safety. [Go to the website to see the video.](#)
