Featured this month is our new selected bibliography on [Elder abuse and neglect](#). This highlights key New Zealand and international research and resources on this topic. It is available on the NZFVC website in a variety of file formats.

In the News section, concerns continue to be raised about changes to the Family Court compromising the safety of people experiencing family violence. These include unacceptable delays in a new processing system in Auckland, the introduction of fixed fees for legal aid in family law and ongoing concerns about the Family Disputes Resolution service proposed in the [Family Court reforms](#) announced at the beginning of August.

Funding opportunities are open: Te Punanga Haumaruru, to support whānau and community-driven action to encourage positive social behaviour in children and reduce bullying in the home and community; and two funds for those working with Pasifika communities to prevent family violence. Consultation on the Children's Commissioner's paper [Solutions to Child Poverty](#) is also underway.

Check the Events section for *NEW* listings. Also a reminder that the White Ribbon Men's Hui will be held on the North Island's East Coast this month (21-23 September) and registration is now open for the Women's Refuge conference in Blenheim (26-27 October).
