Pathways towards accountability: Mapping the journeys of perpetrators of family violence. Report to Department of Premier and Cabinet. Melbourne, Vic: Centre for Innovative Justice.

Summary: In September 2016 the CIJ was asked to prepare a high level overview of the journeys that perpetrators of family violence take as the service system becomes aware of their behaviour. Knowledge is limited, of course, about these journeys, in part because of the reluctance of perpetrators to engage with services or disclose abuse; as well as a justifiable advocacy and policy focus kept firmly on victims... Many of the young people experience poor mental health and social function before, during and after leaving care. Rigorously evaluated interventions are urgently required.
