Kia ora,

We hope that you are all keeping warm, safe and dry as the seasons change. There are continuing significant impacts on communities as a result of the recent climate related weather events and we acknowledge the additional stress and anxiety that further flooding events last week will have created for some of you.

This week is Budget week and in a pre-Budget statement released on Saturday, Ministers Marama Davidson and Priyanka Radhakrishnan announced that Budget 2023 will include \$73.48 million for family violence and sexual violence. The announcements include initiatives aimed at “addressing gaps, improving outcomes [and] maintaining momentum”, with \$36.51 million allocated to initiatives focussing on outcomes for tamariki and rangatahi, people with disabilities and Māori.

Also this month, the 29th of May marks international Rainbow Family Violence Awareness Day. Our Pānui includes a News Story outlining a range of new resources that focus on supporting professionals who work with Rainbow communities in relation to sexual and family violence, as well as resources for parents of Rainbow rangatahi.
